Greetings from Pastor Al

As we start a new year, I encourage you to look at your discipleship and think of the ways it has been bringing meaning and purpose to your life. Thanks for using your gifts and abilities in this church community and in the larger community. I hope the Holy Spirit continues to feed and strengthen your spirit in this place, Good Shepherd. If you want to begin this new year by stretching your discipleship or if you are new to Good Shepherd or looking at us for the first time, please consider these possibilities to nurture your discipleship and get to know Good Shepherd better.

First, feed your soul on a regular basis. There is an old analogy that goes something like this: I might not remember what I ate last week or even yesterday but if I did not eat at all I would be starving. You might not remember what was preached last Sunday, but you are spiritually fed by it. Feed your spirituality with regular worship here at Good Shepherd. You will be in a healthy community that is nurtured by the story of God's committed love to his people and you will be enabled to help others know of that committed love by how we tell and share it together.

Be sure to nurture your family's discipleship. In Little Lambs (ages 4-5 year olds), S. S. Shepherd (Sunday School for 1st—4th graders), or Grapple (our 5th—6th graders) we offer the tools that help kids come to know the talents the Spirit has blessed them with and have a chance to use them. They may be in the Christmas play, helping with the Heifer Project, or learning about our Malaria Campaign. By having them involved you give them the chance to build on their discipleship. You also have them involved with mentors (their teachers and shepherds) who grow to know and care for your child.



Wednesday Youth Nights at Good Shepherd are a blast of energized discipleship. 7th—9th grades are going through our "Faith Inkubators" program with Pastor Ben and their small group leaders as their guides. Our 10th-12th graders have busy schedules but they meet once a month on Wednesdays and are gearing up for a major discipleship workshop and mission event called the Churchwide Youth Gathering taking place in New Orleans this summer. Twenty-six of our teens are going, along with four visiting teens, and six adults. "Citizens with the Saints" is the theme—see Pastor Ben's article.

Adult Forum (9:15 on Sundays) meets in the Welcome Area of the church while Sunday School is going on in the Fellowship Area. I'll be leading discussion of Rob Bell's tour "Everything is Spiritual". We have discussed the short DVDs of Rob Bell's in the past but his tour presentations are much more in depth.



This 4 part series starts on Jan. 8th. If you have someone 17—30 years old in your family dealing with issues regarding faith and science you will appreciate this series. Put it on your calendar.



Group Life at Good Shepherd is the various small groups that our disciples enjoy being a part of to learn more about scripture, prayer, or various books that enrich our faith. Please take a **Group Life** brochure and look through it to see what might be a good fit for your discipleship. New groups that developed this last year are the Men's Huddles, Soul Sisters, Together With Jesus Prayer Group, and the Women's Lunch Hour Group. More info is in the brochure.

You might be going on a diet this new year regarding food, but please feed your discipleship with his spiritual food. Meaning and purpose grows from this kind of nutrition.

And when you become involved as one of our rotation teachers you will become a mentor too. You will find it lights up your discipleship. (9:15 on Sundays)

Greetings from Pastor Ben

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

This coming July, 30+ youth and adults will be heading back down to New Orleans for the triennial Churchwide Youth Gathering (elca.org/gathering). We will be joined by 30,000 other youth and adults from around the globe. The theme of the week is Citizens with the Saints, based on a passage from Paul's letter to the Ephesians:

*Jesus is our peace. In his life and death on the cross, Jesus broke down the dividing walls so that we are no longer strangers and outsiders, but we are **citizens with the saints** and also members of the household of God. The foundation of God's house was built of apostles and prophets, and Jesus, the cornerstone, holds it all together.*

One of the emphases for the week is to practice **Discipleship, Peacemaking, Justice**. Each day we will focus on a different practice – from growing deeper in our faith, to serving the community, to interactive learning about what it means to be a peacemaker in the world.

As I was reflecting on these Christian practices I thought: what if we didn't wait until July to start practicing? What if more than just our youth practiced these things? What if these were practices of our congregation? What if practicing discipleship, peacemaking, and justice were our New Year's resolutions? Resolutions that actually make a difference in our lives and in the life of the world.

The beauty of making these resolutions is that they grow and go with us. The resolution to practice assumes we're not going to have it all together. The goal is get better, to be more comfortable in it. And as we grow, how we live out these resolutions will change. Maybe practicing discipleship begins with reading scripture devotionally once a week and then eventually grows to once a day. Maybe practicing peacemaking begins with our own recognition of what is not peaceful in our own lives and grows to reaching out in reconciliation with another. Maybe practicing justice begins with an awareness of what troubles us in the world and grows into a passionate effort to change something about it.

Practicing assumes that we'll mess up. That we won't get it right all the time. But we're not in it alone. We are citizens with all the saints who surround us each and every day. And Jesus holds it all together, for he is our peace.

Over the next few months, I will reflect more about what **Discipleship, Peacemaking, and Justice** might look like in our lives and at Good Shepherd. Please consider giving the "gift of life" by being a blood donor for the American Red Cross hosted by Good Shepherd on **Thursday, February 2nd, 2:00-6 p.m.** Our goal is to have 30 blood donors.

Help is also needed the day of the drive such as checking in donors, hosting the snack area and helping in the clinical area. Food donations are also needed.

Good Shepherd Supports ELCA Malaria Campaign

The ELCA Malaria Campaign has recently become a part of Good Shepherd's fundraising efforts. The "Books Against Bugs" book sale held in November raised close to \$350 for the campaign, and more money has been given by the congregation via envelopes placed in the pews. The total collected for the program so far is \$865.

Good Shepherd's fundraising is part of a much larger campaign running throughout the ELCA. Since 2009, nearly \$2 million has been raised. The ELCA's goal is to raise \$15 million by the end of 2015.

Information about the program has been passed on to the congregation in a number of ways, including presentations during church services and at an Adult Forum. Cathy Severin, who is spearheading the project at Good Shepherd along with Diane Hope, also presented the project to the Sunday School on three Sundays.

While this is a relatively new ELCA initiative, the Good Shepherd congregation was initially introduced to the issue years before by Katie Rasmussen, daughter of Chuck and Holly Rasmussen. In 2005, Katie went to Kenya and Tanzania as part of an exchange program and became aware of the malaria epidemic and its affects on Sub Saharan Africa. She became interested in the Drive Against Malaria effort, which was spearheaded by a man who had dedicated his life to driving across remote areas of Africa to distribute malaria nets. Upon returning to the United States she started an effort to raise money to support the Drive Against Malaria project and she shared her experiences with Good Shepherd. The congregation took an immediate interest in the program, and the first collection of funds to support the drive raised over \$1,500. That money helped purchase 700 nets, helping 2,800 people.

Fundraising for the ELCA Malaria Project will continue at Good Shepherd and throughout the ELCA until the end of 2015.

Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Celebration

On behalf of Justiceworks, Ltd., a non-profit community justice organization, we would like to invite you, your co-workers, family and friends to the ***Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Celebration*** on Monday, January 16, 2012 from 7:00 -8:30 p.m. Stevens Point Area Senior High School 1201 Northpoint Drive Stevens Point, WI

Admission to the event is free and open to the entire community.

The objectives of the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day (MLK) Community Celebration are to:

- Educate community members on the historical significance of the civil rights movement
- Recognize the legacy of Martin Luther King, Jr.
- Bring focus to social and restorative justice principles
- Bring focus to local, state and national justice issues

This year, the program will feature our keynote guest, University of Wisconsin-Madison associate professor, writer and performer, Patrick Sims. Professor Sims is founding director of the University of Wisconsin-Madison Theatre for Cultural and Social Awareness in the Department of Theatre and Dance. Mr. Sims will perform a chapter of history focusing on civil rights activist, James Cameron. The performance, an excerpt from "10 Perfect: A Lynching Survivor's Story, brings a message of survival and reconciliation and is suitable for students of junior high age and older.

Also included in the program are musical performances by the Monteverdi Master Chorale and the Stevens Point Senior High School Choir. The 2012 Justiceworks John Klismet Justice Award will be presented to Patti Cahill, in recognition of her volunteer contributions to the legal system.

Through the Martin Luther King, Jr. Day Community Celebration, faith-based organizations of our community can support restorative justice princi-

ples by educating our area youth and communities about the significance of the civil rights movement and the importance of social justice and equal justice opportunities. In addition, it is our hope that this fifth annual Martin Luther King, Jr. Community Celebration will encourage community members to participate in community volunteer justice projects. The volunteer interfaith-based MLK event is growing; currently, thirteen community and faith-based organizations are represented in event planning and as funding sponsors.
